
Enjoy riding the trains? Lou machined all seventeen sets of truck castings for the owners of the cars.

## **TRACK WORK**

All the inside track designated to be pulled has been completely pulled. The jig (first of multiple jigs?) for building the new track panels is being used to construct panels using the new construction method which includes use of plastic ties, tie plates, and different rail joiners. Approximately 20 panels, including straight and 100' radius sections have been built.

The fun part is that we have to build **350+** new panels!! Come on down! You can learn how to build panels; or you can help prepare the materials so that panels can be constructed; or you can help move them to storage or to their place of use; or you can help put them in the ground, especially if the nice weather continues (your editor predicts NOT). Remember, no one is to build any panels without having received THE instructions for putting the panels together.

Even with the new ties being donated by Larry Kirchner, there are thousands of connecting parts to be supplied by the club. The Board has decided to start a Track Fund account to be set up to be used just for new construction. The Society is a 501(c)3 tax-exempt corporation. ## DIRECTIONS TO SNYDER'S

Snyder's Willow Grove Restaurant is on Hammonds Ferry Road, right off the Beltway (I-695) at Exit 8, between I-95 to the North and the Baltimore-Washington Parkway (MD 295) to the South. From the outer loop you can see Snyder's sign from the Beltway; take Exit 8 and turn right onto Hammonds Ferry Road at the end of the off-ramp. Snyder's parking lot is immediately on the right. From the inner loop, it is a little trickier; take Exit 8 which leads you onto Fairview Avenue, then turn right at the light onto Nursery Road. Travel under the Beltway and turn right onto Hammonds Ferry at the first signal. Snyder's is about ¼ mile ahead, past the traffic signal for the outer loop interchange and immediately on the right.
